What Does Quentin Blake Create?

Quentin Blake is a famous British illustrator, author, and cartoonist. He is best known for creating:

- Funny, lively illustrations for children's books
- Artwork that brings stories to life with loose, energetic lines
- Drawings for famous books by Roald Dahl, like Matilda, The BFG, and The Twits
- His own picture books, such as *Clown*, *Zagazoo*, and Mrs Armitage on Wheels
- Illustrations for hospitals, schools, galleries, and even walls!



Childhood

- Born on 16 December 1932 in Sidcup, Kent, England
- Loved drawing from a very young age
- Sent his first drawing to **Punch** magazine when he was just 16
- Grew up during World War II and was evacuated as a child
- Enjoyed reading and drawing cartoons

Education

- Studied English at Downing College, Cambridge
- Attended Chelsea School of Art
- Studied at Camberwell School of Art
- Gained a teaching diploma from Institute of Education, London
- Took life drawing classes to improve his artistic skills

Career

- First drawings published in Punch magazine at age 16
- Illustrated his first children's book in 1960 (A Drink of Water by John Yeoman)

- Became the **illustrator for Roald Dahl's books** starting in the 1970s
- Wrote and illustrated many of his own books
- Taught for over 20 years at the **Royal College of Art**, where he also became head of the illustration department
- Appointed the **first Children's Laureate** in the UK (1999–2001)
- Knighted in 2013 for services to illustration
- Created public art for Great Ormond Street Hospital, St Pancras Station, and more
