Who Was Coco Chanel?

Coco Chanel was a famous fashion designer from France. She didn't paint pictures — she created beautiful clothes, perfume, and accessories. Chanel changed fashion by making it simpler, smarter, and stylish.

What's Special About Chanel's Style?

Chanel's fashion designs:

- Are elegant that means they look neat and stylish.
- Use **simple shapes** that are comfy and easy to move in.
- Often mix black and white, but sometimes use soft colours like cream or gold.
- Include fun touches like pearls, bows, or camellia flowers.

Step-by-Step: Try Designing Like Coco Chanel

1. Start With a Simple Shape

Chanel liked clean, neat lines. Try drawing:

- A jacket with straight edges
- A skirt that's not too frilly
- A little black dress

Keep it smart, not too fancy.

2. Choose Your Colours

Chanel's favourite colours were:

- Black
- White
- Beige (creamy tan) 🖤
- Gold

You can use these to make your outfit look classy.

3. Add a Touch of Fancy

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Make it special with small details, like:

- A string of pearls
- A bow
- Buttons in a row O O O
- A little flower

Remember: **less is more** – don't over-decorate.

4. Think About the Person

Chanel believed clothes should help people feel confident. When you design, ask:

- Is it comfy to wear?
- · Can the person move easily?
- Does it look stylish?

Top Chanel Tips for Kids

- Start with neat shapes and clean lines.
- Keep it simple but smart.
- · Use black and white to make bold fashion.
- Add just one or two special details.
- Design clothes people would really want to wear.
