Who is Jim Dine?

Jim Dine is an American artist who loves to use **bold colours**, **big shapes**, and **real objects** in his art. He often draws and paints **hearts**, **tools**, **bathrobes**, and other everyday things—but makes them look **bright**, **emotional**, and **full of meaning**.

What is the Jim Dine Style?

Jim Dine's art is:

- Colourful and messy he uses splashes, scribbles, and bold brush strokes.
- **Emotional** he uses art to show feelings like love, sadness, and energy.
- **Full of objects** he turns normal things (like a hammer or a heart) into something special.
- Layered he often mixes drawing, painting, and collage.

X Tips to Be Like Jim Dine

- Use everyday things in your art.
- Make a mess on purpose!
- Don't worry about being neat.
- Use art to show your **feelings**, not just pictures.
- Mix drawing, painting, and collage all in one.

What You'll Need:

- Paper or card
- Crayons, felt pens, paints, or oil pastels
- Scissors and glue (for collage)
- Magazines or scrap paper
- Optional: a heart shape or picture of a tool

Multimedia Art in the Style of Jim Dine

Step 1: Choose Your Object

Pick something simple and clear to draw—Jim Dine liked:

- A spanner or something from the tool box
- A paintbrush *
- A bathrobe
- A heart Draw the shape big on your paper.

Step 2: Colour with Feeling

Now add colours! Use your favourite crayons, paints, or markers. Think about how you feel:

- Happy? Use yellows and pinks.
- Excited? Try red, orange, and black.
- Calm? Try soft blues and greens.

You can:

- Scribble!
- Smudge!
- · Layer colours on top of each other!

Step 3: Make It Messy

Jim Dine loved textures. Try:

- Flicking paint
- Tearing paper to glue on
- Scratching into crayon with a toothpick
- Dabbing with a sponge

Let it feel wild and free!

Step 4: Add Extra Layers

Glue on pieces of paper, magazine cutouts, or cloth. Draw over the top again if you like. There are **no rules**!

© More Fun Ideas

- Make a Heart That Shows How You Feel Today

 Draw a giant heart and fill it with scribbles, colours, words, or pictures that show your emotions.
- P Heart Art:
 - Recreate Confetti heart with bright colours, patterns, and textures – create a swirly background, once dried, paint a heart on top
 - Recreate Four hearts start by daubing bright and think colourful paint to make your background, once that's dry print four hearts using a cardboard heart cutout
