Who was Marcel Duchamp?

Marcel Duchamp was a French artist who liked to surprise people with his unusual and clever ideas about what art could be. He is most famous for using everyday objects in his work and turning them into art, like a bicycle wheel or even a toilet! His ideas helped create new kinds of art like **Dada** and **Conceptual Art**.

Childhood

- Born in France in 1887 into a creative family with artist brothers and sisters.
- Enjoyed drawing cartoons and playing chess as a child.
- Liked to read books and play practical jokes.
- Grew up in a small town called Blainville-Crevon.

Education

- Went to a special art school in Rouen with his brothers.
- **In 1904**, Duchamp moved to Paris and **studied at the Académie Julian**, a well-known private art school.
- He didn't stay there long—just a year—because he found the traditional teaching style boring and preferred to experiment with his own ideas.
- Enjoyed making funny and unusual drawings while learning about traditional art.
- Loved experimenting with ideas more than copying real-life scenes.
- Marcel Duchamp began interacting with the **Surrealists in the early 1920s**, particularly after **moving to Paris again in 1923**. While he wasn't officially a member of the Surrealist group, he became **friends with key Surrealist artists** like **André Breton**, the leader of the movement.

Career

- Became known for painting in many styles, including Cubism and Futurism.
- Duchamp was especially admired by the Surrealists for his **use of dreams, chance, wordplay, and challenges to traditional art**.

- Shocked the art world by putting a **urinal** in a gallery and calling it “**Fountain**” (1917).
- Created “readymades” – everyday objects turned into art by choosing them.
- Helped lead the **Dada** movement, which was all about being silly and surprising.
- Later focused more on playing chess than making art!
- Inspired many modern artists with his playful and bold ideas.
- In the **1930s**, he helped organize Surrealist exhibitions in Paris and New York and continued collaborating with Surrealist artists.
