Who is Henri Matisse?

Henri Matisse was a French artist who loved **bold colours**, **simple shapes**, and **joyful designs**. Later in his life, he made beautiful pictures using **painted paper cut-outs** — he called it "**drawing with scissors**." His art is full of **energy, colour**, and **movement!**

What you will make

In this tutorial, you'll create a **Matisse-style painting** with **bright, flat colours** and **fun shapes** like **leaves, stars, and dancing figures**.

A You Will Need:

- White paper (A4 or bigger)
- Paint
- Paintbrushes and water
- Pencil
- Black marker for details

Step 1: Pick a Theme

Think of something joyful or fun, like:

- Under the sea
- A garden of shapes 😍
- Dancing stars
- A jungle of colour

Step 2: Paint a Bright Background

- 1. Paint the whole paper one bold colour maybe blue, yellow, or pink.
- 2. Let it dry before adding shapes on top.

Step 3: Add Flat Painted Shapes

- 1. Use bright paints to **paint big, simple shapes** right onto the background:
 - Wiggly leaves
 - Big stars
 - Flowers
 - Circles
 - People dancing
- 2. Matisse used **flat colours** no shading, just one colour per shape!
- **Tip:** Don't worry about making the shapes perfect they should look **fun** and free!

Step 4: Arrange Shapes with Movement

- 1. Place your shapes so they dance across the page.
- 2. Try **overlapping** some shapes or letting them go **off the edge** for movement.

1. Make Your Own Matisse Cut-Out Art!

Matisse loved using paper and scissors to make pictures — this is called **collage**.

You will need:

- · Coloured paper
- Safety scissors
- Glue
- A large piece of paper to stick everything onto

99 Your mission:

- Cut out different shapes: stars, swirls, leaves, hands, and circles
- · Glue them onto your page to make your own Matisse-style art
- · Use bright, happy colours!
- Give your artwork a title just like Matisse did!

2. Collage the Snail!

Matisse made a famous artwork called **"The Snail"** using colourful paper shapes.

Recreate this picture using only bright, bold coloured shapes.
