Create Your Own Joan Miró-Inspired Artwork

Joan Miró loved using bright colours, bold lines, and dream-like shapes to express imagination and play. Follow these steps to create your own Miróstyle masterpiece!

Step 1: Start with a Scribble

Take a black marker or pencil and close your eyes. Draw a big, loopy scribble across your paper. This is your starting point!

Step 2: Find Shapes and Forms

Look closely at your scribble. Can you see any interesting shapes or spaces? Trace around some of them with a black marker to turn them into **organic shapes**—like blobs, ovals, or stars.

Step 3: Add Bright Colours

Now colour in some of the shapes with **bold primary colours**—red, blue, yellow—and leave others white or add dots, stripes, or zigzags.

Step 4: Draw Miro-Style Symbols

Add **Miró-style symbols** around your page. These could be:

- Eyes
- Stars
- Moons
- Ladders **[**
- Arrows
 Draw them in black so they stand out!

Step 5: Connect with Lines

Use thin black lines to connect some of your shapes and symbols—like a little story running across the page. Some lines can be straight, others wiggly or spiraled!
