Childhood

- Born on 28 July 1866 in London, England
- Full name: Helen Beatrix Potter
- Grew up in a wealthy family with a governess instead of going to school
- Loved animals from a young age and kept pets like rabbits, mice, and hedgehogs
- Enjoyed sketching animals and nature during holidays in the countryside

Education

- Did not go to a regular school was taught at home by a governess
- Studied nature and art on her own, especially fungi, plants, and animals
- Took art lessons, especially in watercolours
- Learned scientific drawing and became skilled at painting fungi and flowers

Career

- Started as a scientific illustrator, drawing detailed pictures of mushrooms and lichens
- Wrote and illustrated The Tale of Peter Rabbit in 1902 it became a huge success!
- Created more than 20 children's books, including:
 - o The Tale of Jemima Puddle-Duck
 - ∘ The Tale of Tom Kitten
 - o The Tale of Mrs. Tiggy-Winkle

- Designed her own merchandise like toys and games based on her characters
- Later in life, she became a **farmer and conservationist**, buying land to protect the countryside
