✓ What did he create?

- Diego Velázquez painted portraits, scenes from everyday life, and historical and religious moments
- He was famous for painting the royal family of Spain, including King Philip IV
- His paintings often looked very real with clever use of light, shadow, and perspective
- One of his most famous paintings is "Las Meninas", showing a princess, her maids, and even himself painting in the background!



Childhood

- Born in Seville, Spain, in 1599
- Came from a middle-class family
- Loved to draw and paint from a very young age
- Grew up in a city full of art, culture, and trade

Education

- Started learning art around the age of 11
- Apprenticed with artist Francisco Pacheco, who later became his father-in-law
- Learned how to mix colours, draw accurately, and use oil paints
- Studied classical techniques and the use of perspective
- Inspired by Italian and Flemish painters

Career

- Became a **professional painter** in Seville before the age of 20
- Moved to Madrid and was soon appointed court painter to King Philip IV

- · Painted many portraits of royals, nobles, and court life
- · Visited Italy to study famous artworks and improve his skills
- Became one of the most respected painters in Europe
- His work influenced later artists like Manet and Picasso
