Printing from natural materials

Step 1: Collect Your Natural Materials

Before you can begin printing from nature, you'll need to go on a little adventure to gather your materials!

What to do:

- Head outside to a garden, park, or woodland area with a basket or bag.
- Look for interesting **leaves**, **ferns**, **flowers**, or even **grasses**—anything flat and textured works well.
- Try to choose items that aren't too dry or too thick. Fresh but not soggy works best!
- Be respectful of nature—only pick things that are abundant, and never take from protected areas.

Tip: Look for leaves with raised veins or rough textures—they make beautiful prints!



Step 2: Prepare Your Printing Area and Materials

Now that you've collected your natural items, it's time to get your space ready for printing!

What to do:

- 1. **Find a clean, flat surface** like a table or desk. Cover it with newspaper or scrap paper to protect it.
- 2. Gather your materials:
 - Your collected leaves, flowers, or grasses
 - A rolling pin or brayer
 - Printing inks (water-based block printing ink works well) or acrylic paint

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- A paintbrush or roller
- Printing paper (thicker paper works best)
- A tray or palette to roll out the ink
- 3. Put on an apron or old shirt—you might get a bit messy!

Tip: Have some spare paper nearby to test your prints as you go.

Step 3: Ink Your Natural Object

Now it's time to prepare your leaf or flower for printing!

What to do:

- 1. Choose one of your natural objects—start with a leaf for easier practice.
- 2. Squeeze a small amount of printing ink or paint onto your palette or tray.
- 3. Use a roller or paintbrush to apply a thin, even layer of ink to the **back** (veiny side) of the leaf. This side has more texture and will show better detail in your print.
- 4. Be gentle so you don't tear the leaf or overload it with paint.

Tip: Make sure the ink covers the entire surface evenly, but not so much that it's dripping.



Step 4: Press and Reveal Your Print

Now it's time to make your nature print!

What to do:

1. Place your inked leaf **ink-side down** onto your piece of paper.

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- 2. Gently lay a clean sheet of scrap paper or tissue on top to protect your fingers.
- 3. Press down evenly using your fingers, a clean roller, or the back of a spoon. Make sure you press over every part of the leaf.
- 4. Carefully lift the leaf off the paper to reveal your nature print!

Tip: You can experiment by repeating the print in different colours or combining different leaves to make patterns.
